



HISTORICAL CONTEXT

In the most beautiful Sortelha, we go back to the experiences of the reign of D. Dinis.

The monarch, son of D. Afonso III, ascended to the throne of Portugal in 1279, following the death of his father, in a somewhat contentious manner. His brother, Infante D. Afonso, contested his legitimacy to the throne, arguing that D. Dinis was born before the Pope had recognized the marriage of their parents (D. Afonso III and D. Beatriz), making D. Dinis an illegitimate son.

D. Dinis is one of the key figures in the creation of our national identity and the rise of Portugal's self-awareness as a nation-state. During his reign, he sought to reorganize the internal administration, drafting laws based on the country's political, economic, and social realities, leaving an undeniable and permanent mark on this borderland territory.

A highlight for the region where Sortelha is located was the Treaty of Alcanizes, signed on September 12th, 1297, with King Fernando IV of Castile and León, after a period of tension and multiple military incursions on both sides. This treaty determined the national borders and resolved numerous points of conflict between the two countries.

The Treaty of Alcanizes enumerated a series of towns and fortified positions, some of which were permanently transferred to Castilian control, while others fell under Portuguese rule, with both parties agreeing to accept the division and renounce any future claims.

This border delimitation was part of D. Dinis' broader diplomatic and defensive strategy aimed at securing a solid and lasting peace with the neighbouring kingdom.

This political alliance was sealed by the marriage of Infanta D. Constança of Portugal to King Fernando IV of Castile, and in return, the marriage of Infante D. Afonso of Portugal — the future King D. Afonso IV — to D. Beatriz of Castile, sister of King Fernando IV of Castile.

During his reign, D. Dinis took steps to stimulate agriculture, which earned him the nickname 'The Farmer'. He granted land for cultivation to those who did not own property, promoted the clearing of uncultivated land, and provided tax exemptions for certain crops, such as vines.

Sortelha is the ideal setting to travel back in time... there is no other place where you will feel so transported to the Middle Ages as in our 'Muralhas com História'.

EXHIBITION AREAS

◆ Military and Knight's Camp

Composed of displays of weapons, helmets, shields, medieval-style cooking, and medieval tents. Here, combat techniques are trained, military tactics are defined, and military drills are conducted, as the alert is permanent. Visitors can also interact with horses and learn about the lives of knights and their squires.

+ Tournament Field

Space for recreation of medieval tournaments on horseback and foot, as well as demonstrations with birds of prey.

◆ Camping with Medieval Experiences

It consisted of a campaign kitchen, armoury and production of chain mail, scriptorium of calligraphy, weaving, braiding and embroidery, giving an insight into the people's way of life back then.

Medieval Crafts

In Rua dos Ofícios, some of the arts and crafts that existed in the Middle Ages are recreated, such as blacksmithing, woodworking, net-making, and leather tanning.

* Falconry

Falconry is the art of raising, training, and caring for falcons and other birds of prey for hunting. Some documents on falconry show that it was an aristocratic sport, in which kings and other powerful members of the courts participated.

*Children's Camp 'TRAQUINAS' and Medieval Games

A space where adults and children can experience skill, balance, and concentration games, as well as educational workshops inspired by medieval culture and the carousel.

+ Farm Animals

Exhibition of farm animals that once roamed freely in the streets of the old village.
